

SHARE Plan Project Tool

*Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name,
Your kingdom come, Your will be done
on earth as it is in heaven. Matt. 6:9-10*

Step One – Form a project group. For many, this will be your Home Group or Growth Group.

Step Two – Read Ephesians 1:18-19 and pray, thanking God for the power that is ours in Christ.

Step Three – Review the five values that will characterize God’s Kingdom when it comes in fullness.

- **Security:** God’s Kingdom will be a place of absolute security (absence of evil).
And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.” Rev. 21:3-4
- **Health:** In God’s Kingdom we will enjoy perfect health.
“But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.” Phil. 3:20-21
- **Abundance:** In God’s Kingdom we will enjoy prosperity and fullness.
“Every man will sit under his own vine and under his own fig tree, and no one will make them afraid, for the LORD Almighty has spoken.” Micah 4:4
- **Relationships:** God’s Kingdom will be a place of rich community.
“‘In that day each of you will invite his neighbor to sit under his vine and fig tree,’ declares the LORD Almighty.” Zech. 3:10
- **Equity:** In God’s Kingdom all wrongs will be righted and justice will reign.
“Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David’s throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.” Isaiah 9:7

Step Four – Have group members share which of these five Kingdom values is most meaningful to them, and why (e.g. a person who grew up in a broken home may especially resonate with the **security** of God’s completed Kingdom).

Step Five – Imagine some possible projects that reflect one or more of the five Kingdom values in SHARE. Pick a group scribe and brainstorm as many as you can, as quickly as you can. This is a time to be creative and to avoid evaluating.

Step Six – Review your list, highlighting those projects that seem to match specific needs in your community.

Step Seven – Among the highlighted projects, identify which ones complement the gifts, talents, and passions of your group.

Final Step – Choose a project and plan your first step. Share your project plan with FBC by contacting Meg Harper at mharper@fbcdavis.org.

Final Considerations: Projects can either be short or long-term in nature. Short-term projects can be ideal for FBC groups that are meeting only for the Fall Focus. Long-term projects provide greater potential for developing relationships that can be life-changing. We encourage groups to **dream big but realize that no project is too small**.
